To date, the Civil Service, British Telecom and Royal Mail have funded 52 lifeboats and helped the RNLI's volunteer crews save 4,700 lives. By the end of 2018, we are aiming to raise £1.1M towards a new Shannon class all-weather lifeboat for Wells Lifeboat Station. MAYDAY HEALTH AND SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS

We want you to create excitement and have fun but, if you're planning your own event, remember that charity fundraising is regulated by law. You'll find our full guide to legal information for fundraisers at **thelifeboatfund.org.uk/fundraising**.

Below are just some of the things you might need to check before your event goes ahead:

- **Permission** wherever you organise an event, the person, company or authority who owns the area/land will need to give you the go-ahead to do it.
- Permits your local authority may have regulations which require permits and licences.
- Risk assessments make sure your participants know about any hazards or health requirements.
- Insurance for your event and participants.
- **Medical information** required for each participant alongside emergency contact details. You'll also need enough trained first-aiders for the size of your event.
